A fragmented education, mainly due to ill-health, at Brighton Grammar School, England, was followed by some more pragmatic training in Brighton Technical College, where, during three years' study, he just managed to qualify for entry in the Engineering Profession. A tendency towards extra-curricular activities explains these marginal academic results; but included Presidency of The Brighton Students' Association. The first gainful occupation was as Apprentice with the G.E.Co. Telephone Works at Coventry and subsequently with the British P.O. Telecommunications Department.
