Dear Collee, Graham & Valerie & Jo
Grandma had Capetown
for Johanneburg, 6 PM, had a
deep day in the lovely gardens on the slope
of Table Mt. It is a glorious day and I
feel rather sad at leaving Capetown. I
have had four full & very nice days.
The roses are out on their freigher
Sat Oct 1, which I'll be gone. Mary & Charles
will be pushing around & busy getting off
I have forwarded to seeing them in Cape
in the air - Jo'burg - Salisbury, a lovely day
dear, on a South African plane. I hope
to be able to see the Victoria Falls from Salisbury.
I never got my visa to enter Zambia, so there
goes 35/- when on a drive around Cape Point
I saw kudu and a dear little baby one also
elands (a species of deer) and baboons, one was
carrying her little baby baboon clasp to her
stomach with one arm. I also saw 4 ostriches
the male is black & white and the female
is grey, their eggs are the equivalent of 24
leaves eggs. I have gotten to depend on my
morning tea, it really gives one a lift. In
Africa the trees are all coming into leaf
& the veld is a blaze of wild flowers of
every colour, mostly in the form of a daisy.
Sheep have rain and the calves, and
feel it is raining in Capetown today but
here in Jo'burg & Salisbury is very dry
one must be very careful of the water.
Today Mary & Charles will be very busy
as they leave tonight - poor little Maest
will hate to see them go but anyhow they
have to see both the girls so they won't

feel so alone. Suppose

when that is done she could speed up the house
and then do some work for you. We were
affessie Woods to a very nice buffet supper on
Friday night and next week Norman is taking us to
the races. We are up early this a.m. to go to Methodist
Church at 8.30 a.m. yesterday Joyce & Devent to town
for a couple of hours and in the afternoon we
listened to the state funeral on the radio. How who is
to be the next premier is the vital question, here in
south africa people feel things keenly, one must be
100% for or against as an issue. There are many
intensely religious people. I heard of a man who
giving up his wife, gave all his money & property
to his children and went to work in a mission, he
lived there & eventually married the matron, he just gets
his living and a mere pittance. I am waiting for
the balance in the morning sun and it is very
pleasant. I am wondering if hurricane faith did any
